To accomplish our mission, we begin with providing affordable, high-end media, and technology services.

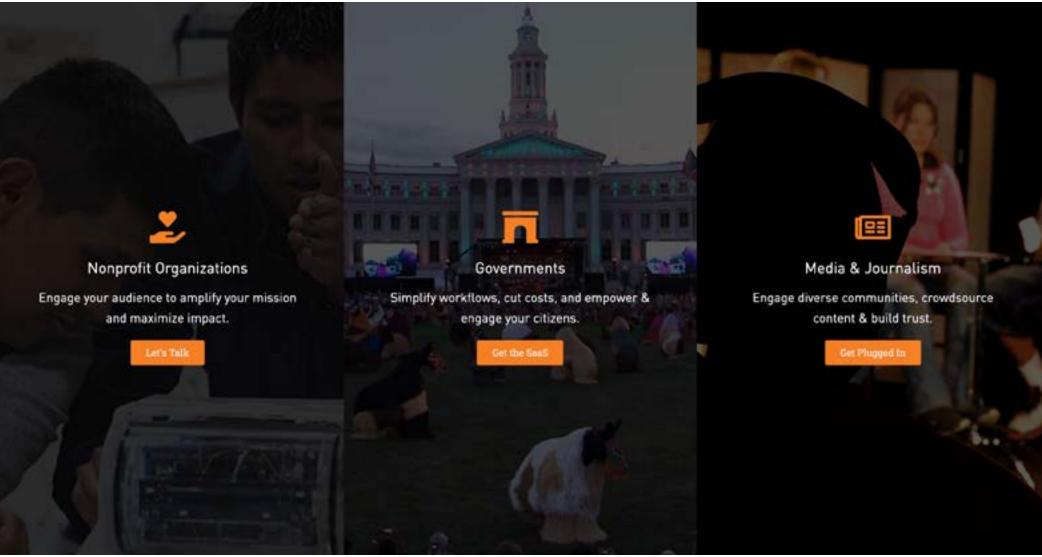
We follow up by offering training and tools that enable everyone to represent their own voice in the media conversation journalism industry.

Census 2020

Open Media Foundation's goal with the 2020 Census was to mobilize the least likely to respond populations to complete Census 2020; to alleviate fears and undo preconceived notions about Census and how that data is used, to educate the population that their participation in Census leads to billions of dollars annually in federal funding for key social benefit programs in Healthcare, Education, and Congressional representation in Colorado.

By creating and distributing community-crafted information regarding, we were able to convey important messaging to our hard to count communities, encouraging their participation.

WEB

The Second Wind Fund, a non-profit dedicated to youth suicide prevention in Colorado, came to Open Media with a brand cohesion conundrum. They had spent a great deal of time and effort on designing a new logo with refreshed colors and fonts to honor the evolution and growth of their org. Upon reaching completion of their rebranding process, SWF struggled to find the right opportunity to reveal their new look-and-feel. With an inkling to renew the design of their website, Second Wind Fund reached out to Open Media and we went down a design path that aligned with their new brand. SWF's trust in our nonprofit web design process opened them up to feel comfortable seeing themselves in a new light.

OMCE:

With a grant from the Colorado Workforce Development Council, the Open Media Career Engine continued to realize its impact assisting news organizations in diversifying their workforce.

TRAINING -

After having shifted our training programs to focus entirely on radio, podcasting and audio production in 2019, the pandemic limited our in person class offerings.

2020 continued the transition phase that began in 2019. We moved into a new facility at 2101 Arapahoe with our partners at KUVO, KGNU, and Rocky Mountain PBS, among others. While COVID caused a major disruption in our business, especially our work streaming live events, our 6-month project for the Census helped us continue steady work through the most tumultuous months. That project resulted in over a dozen TV commercials, two dozen radio spots, and several more social media initiatives that reached a combined audience of millions with messages from traditionally hard-to-count communities.

Open Music Sessions: 2020 saw an end to our long-running local music, comedy, and performance event, Open Music Sessions. After 15 years of hosting hundreds of Colorado's best performers, COVID forced us to shift to virtual performances, and as the months wore on, we decided to end the series. Over 100 bands and performers can still be seen on our website and on our radio stations. We are looking to 2022 as a possible year to revive this program Our Open Media Careers Engine program really took-off in 2020, with a grant from the Colorado Workforce Development Council. Aiming to help media and journalism organizations increase the diversity of their staff, 8 of our first 10 hires were people of color, and 7 were women, in an industry where nearly 80% of staff are traditionally white, and are men. This free HR service casts a far wider net for openings, evaluating over 30 job boards for the diversity and quality of applicants generated by each. We help improve job descriptions, post to as many as 20 job boards, track and survey all applicants, and schedule interviews to provide a level of DEI in the HR process that most small media and journalism organizations cannot afford to do on their own.

Our Creative Services department continued to serve nonprofit, government, and media clients with web, video and other communications services. We added our 50th government agency to our open.media streaming service, making searchable, transcribed video of government meetings accessible to thousands of constituents. While there was a drop in work for several months of COVID, the PPP and EIDL programs helped cover those losses, necessitating only minor downsizing through attrition (and no layoffs).
